**Sunday School News**  
Children 2½ through 4<sup>th</sup> grade will learn about the story of the loaves and fishes (Matthew 14:13-21). Jesus had been teaching all day to crowds of people. When dinnertime approached,

the disciples came to Jesus telling him to turn the crowds away because there was not enough food to feed all them. Jesus told the disciples to bring what food they could find. There was a boy carrying a basket of bread and fish, and the disciples took the basket to Jesus. They told the crowds to sit down. Jesus took the food and, looking up to heaven, blessed the food and gave it to the disciples to distribute to the crowds and “all ate and were filled” (Matthew 14:20). The faith trait for this lesson is generosity. The boy showed generosity as he shared his bread and fish with the crowds.

The 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders will discuss “How do I know if the Bible is true?” Key faith foundation: the Bible is alive and powerful. Key scriptures: Matthew 4:1-11; Hebrews 4:12-13; II Peter 1:16-19.
