Through the Valley of the Shadow: The Comfort and Hope of Death and Resurrection

In Lent we reflect on death and resurrection. Each of us experiences death ranging from the deaths of those whom we love to the deaths represented by day-to-day losses like loss of a job, divorce, diminished health, etc. We may also find ourselves in the large company of people who prefer to avoid all talk and consideration of death. After all, it is more hopeful and pleasant to focus on resurrection. Regardless, as resurrection is real, so is death. How do life's many deaths affect us? How do we find comfort in the midst of those deaths? How does resurrection offer hope for the tomorrows beyond these deaths? What are the practical, daily implications of living in the tension between death and resurrection? How can we ritualize our deaths and celebrate resurrection? Come, join us as we explore these issues.

Children 2½ through 4th grade will learn about Jesus the healer (Matthew 9:18-19, 23-26). A leader of the synagogue came to Jesus in desperation because his daughter

had died. He asked Jesus to revive her, showing his trust in Jesus. Upon approaching the synagogue leader's home, the sounds of mourners greeted Jesus. He sent them away, saying the girl was not dead. They laughed at Jesus — how can he know this? He had not yet seen the girl, and they had been present for some time. The father of the girl urged the mourners to leave and Jesus entered the house. He took the girl by the hand and she got up. The news of her healing spread. The faith trait for this lesson is joy. The father of the girl showed great happiness caused by seeing his daughter alive!

The 5th & 6th graders will discuss "How is the Bible different from other books?" The key faith foundation: the Bible is a message from God. The key scriptures: Psalm 19:7-11; John 20:30-31; Romans 1:16-17.

Pocket Change Project

A Cherub Choir Initiative
Lent 2010



Our Goal:

To collect enough pocket change during the season of Lent to sponsor a child in Haiti for one year. Our gift will provide a quality education in a Christian environment, a hot meal every day, and the opportunity to commit their life and future to Jesus Christ our Lord.

Why pocket change?

Because we usually don't think very much about those small coins in our pockets and purses. But added up, all those small coins can have a tremendous impact on someone's life.

Why the Cherub Choir?

Because we usually don't think very much about how a group of small children can impact the world. But added up, a group of small children can have a tremendous impact.

Bottom Line:

A handful of small coins—collected by a handful of small children—can impact the life of just **one** small child in Haiti in a tremendous way. And our goal is to collect those coins because we know that ...

big change starts small.
