Guest Preacher: Reverend Dr. Asa Lee



Today we welcome the **Reverend Dr. Asa Lee** to the pulpit. Dr. Lee serves as president and professor of theological formation for ministry at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, a position he has held since 2021.

Before coming to Pittsburgh, he served for eight years at Wesley Theological Seminary as assistant director of programs for the church leadership center, associate dean for community life, director of African American Church Studies, and vice president for campus administration. During this same span, he served for 10 years as assistant pastor and minister of Christian education for Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Arlington, Va., and was previously the minister of worship and arts for St. John Baptist Church in Columbia, Md. Dr. Lee holds membership in the American Academy of Religion, the Religious Education

Association, and the Association of Leadership Educators, and he is the acting president of the FaithJustice Foundation. He holds degrees from Virginia Theological Seminary, Wesley Theological Seminary, and Hampton University. Dr. Lee is an ordained minister in the Progressive National Baptist Convention.
