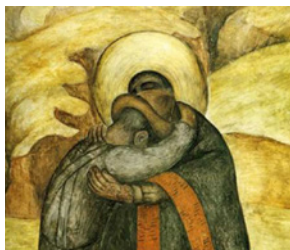

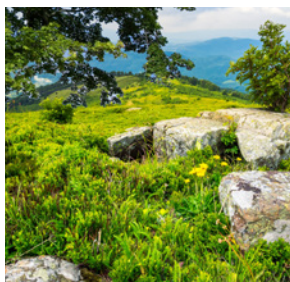

Wednesdays, January 18 through February 15 at 4:30 in Rm. 231.

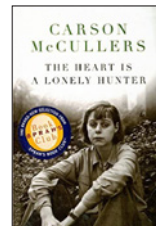
