ADVOCATE for and with our neighbors on various social justice issues affecting local and global historically disenfranchised communities



2020-2021 PROGRAM SNAPSHOT



- •Served 1,725 lunch and dinner meals, 535 boxes of fresh vegetables, fruit, and dairy, distributed critical care items such as masks, hygiene and cleaning products, warm coats for kids, and more!
- •Distributed 61 computers to youth and adults living in West Oakland, Oak Hill (Terrace Village), and Hill District
- •Provided \$9,100 in emergency financial assistance to support families, seniors and artists impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic
- Worked with community partners to create a 16-week virtual reading literacy and video game coding program connecting youth K-8th grade to engaging lessons and STEAM focused enrichment activities
